

Fishers Health Department Update - 3/18/2024

Senate Enrolled Act 4 - "Health First Indiana" Governors Public Health Commission Legislation

- Budget for 2025 to be submitted to IDOH by 6/1/24.
- Funding for 2025 should be double the \$1,001,725.50 received in 2024.

Community Health Assessment:

• Continuing work on health assessment and readiness for accreditation process.

Core Health Services

- Immunizations & Testing: 222 patients seen for immunizations and testing services in February with steady demand for tuberculosis testing (67). Seven COVID-19 and one blood lead test administered.
- 55 active reportable conditions managed at a steady pace and monitored for outbreak potential.
- More than halfway through credentialling process to accept insured patients for all services (currently accept most insurance coverage for vaccines only via third party).

Health Education

• 16 health education sessions offered in February to 2,176 individuals.

Mental Health

<u>Stigma Free Fishers</u> platform & <u>Community Resource List</u> continue to see increase in usage and awareness. Over 9,008 unique users and 10,710 sessions since launch on May 1, 2023. Majority of users from Fishers and surrounding area, female, and younger than 25 years of age. Most common features used are mental health assessments around depression and anxiety, and 702 unique resources used.

Environmental Health & Inspections

- New food inspector trained.
- Use the <u>Food Grade and Inspection Dashboard</u> to view grades and inspection reports. To date in 2024, graded 116/359 permanent establishments (98 A, 8 B, 7 C). Graded 4/27 food trucks (4 A). Graded 0/7 temporary establishments.
- Anticipate statewide food code change to take effect on or around July 1, 2024. Planning a communication and outreach plan for local operators as more information becomes available.

Community Outreach and Social Media

 PLAID, communications agency hired, to roll out new look for FHD starting with April social media. Be on the lookout!





Public Health Social Work

- In February, 150 individuals referred to social work program. Social worker and community
 health advocates connecting individuals to services and care for substance use disorder, disability
 resources, mental health counseling, caregiver support, home health care, assisted living, and
 more.
- All FPD emergency detention individuals automatically referred to social worker for enhanced support on mental health crises; 28 individuals year to date.
- Fall prevention program recruiting individuals with recent falls from FFD EMS calls. Conducting in-home risk assessments, minor modifications, and referrals to reduce risk of fall in home. Currently coordinating evidence-based Matter of Balance course in collaboration with Purdue University for residents in September and October.
- Social needs assessment to identify barriers to physical, mental, and social well-being launched in clinic on February 19, 2024. Program offers on-site social work support to any clinic patient. To date, 51 individuals have
- completed the needs assessment requesting support with employment, connection to medical care providers, assistance with food/housing/financial insecurity, social isolation, and literacy.

Grants and Funding:

- Grant funding request submitted for Vaccines for Children federal program for third year. This
 funding has supported nursing and outreach staff, in addition to vaccines for uninsured and
 underinsured clients.
- Health department finalizing grant application process for school-based student-led clubs to conduct health-focused or service-focused initiatives. Awards up to \$500 available.
- Health department finalizing contracts for awards to community agencies focused on access to care and prevention efforts.
